Technology

It is imperative for students in today's world to be able to use the latest technology to become creative and critical thinkers who will make a positive impact on the world. In support of this goal, our school has a wide variety of tech tools available for student use.

- ⇒ Projectors and Interactive SMART boards in most every room (projectors are now being upgraded to wireless projectors)
- ⇒ Document cameras in selected rooms (as needed); audio enhancement and security systems for Grades K-4, with plans to equip the rest of the school before next year; computers for Grades PK-5 (Grades 3-5 will be getting six brand new touchscreen laptops in each room)
- \Rightarrow 4 mobile carts, each with 30 touchscreen *Windows* 8 devices for use in all rooms, including PK; Grades 4-8 have *Office* 365 accounts which allow them to download full versions of Microsoft Office for use at home on 5 devices; a specific curriculum targeted at teaching ethical and fair use of technology, including social media

I thank the *Thrift Store volunteers* for their wonderful work in raising funds to serve the needy in our area. This year they are contributing \$48,000 to our Tuition Assistance program.
